



# Household Hazardous Waste

## *Recycling & Disposal Program*

This service is available to all Lucas County residents and is limited to *individual households*. No materials from business or industrial sites will be accepted.

### Why bring your household hazardous waste?

Household products containing toxic chemicals can be a threat to people and the environment if improperly discarded. Never throw these materials into the trash, as the toxic chemicals may harm sanitation workers, or result in fires in collection vehicles. It is also not safe to pour them into a sink or storm drain, as they can end up in the environment polluting the air, water, or soil.



### How do I safely transport these hazardous materials?

Leave materials in original container. Tighten caps & lids and pack containers in sturdy, upright boxes & pad with newspaper. Sort & pack separately. NEVER MIX CHEMICALS. Never smoke around or while handling hazardous materials.

\* Latex paint is accepted, however, it is not hazardous and can be disposed with regular trash, if solidified. Cat litter, sand, saw dust or soil can be used to solidify latex paint. A box lined with a trash bag or partially filled paint cans can hold the solidified material. If paint cans are used, leave lid off so waste hauler can see the paint is dry.
